Weekly Reflection - Never Walk Alone

Captain Tom Moore walked for 10 laps of his garden for 10 days to raise £1000 for the NHS staff. He started alone, just watched by members of his family. 10 days later he completed his 100 laps, raised over £27 million and had a guard of honour from his old regiment and the eyes of the world watched him through the power of the media. He also recorded a song with Michael Ball, 'I'll never walk alone', which has made it to the top of the charts.

Approximately 2000 years ago, 2 people were walking alone going home to Emmaus, pondering on the events in Jerusalem of that first Easter weekend, the death of Jesus on the Cross and his reported Resurrection, the missing body from the tomb. They were joined by a stranger who walked with them to Emmaus and stayed for a meal. It was during the meal that they recognised that the stranger was Jesus. In these difficult times, Jesus will walk with each one of us. We don't have to walk alone. He can be at our side providing comfort and support. You only have to ask him to be there. Amen
