Weekly Reflection

'Stay home, stay safe' – how often have we heard that over the past few weeks. However, for many people that isn't easy, particularly if they live alone and are not able to see family and friends or just get out to the shops. And yet it's impossible to exaggerate the importance of home. Seventy five years ago many people were desperate to get home – they too were separated from family and friends because of war. Now the war in Europe was over and those serving in the armed forces, prisoners of war and others were at last going to be able to go home – home to safety. To have a home is not just to have a house. It is to have a set of close ties with people who accept us for what we are, and who give us a feeling of belonging.

During the Last Supper Jesus began to talk to the apostles about the fact that he was leaving them. On hearing this, they were plunged into sorrow. But he consoled them with these words, which are probably the most comforting words in the Gospel: "There are many rooms in my Father's house. I am going to prepare a place for you. I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be too." This means that we have an eternal home to go to, namely the Father's house.


