Weekly Reflection: John 17: 1-11, Acts 1: 6-14

Poor disciples. What have they been through over the last few weeks! What wild swings of emotion have they had to deal with. First the horrors of Good Friday, the anguish they felt for their friend, fear for themselves and the confusion about the future now that Jesus' mission had apparently failed. Then there were the rumours – he was alive and their lives are once again thrown into turmoil. Can this be really true? And then, at last, normality returns. Jesus is back among them and for a short time they slip back into what is familiar, shared meals, wine, and storytelling. They are comrades in arms once again – well for a short time!

As the season of Easter draws to an end, the disciples are once again in the upper room. Jesus has left again and apparently, this time for good. Now with time on their hands, they reflect on their life together and realise they have learned two important things from their short, but extraordinary time with Jesus, that is the power of true friendship and the need to keep praying.

These two things will sustain and hold this small band of disciples together in times of joy, hardship and sorrow as they begin to lay the foundations of a new community of believers - the Church.

Looking at the world today, the predicament the disciples found themselves in might resonate with many of us. With so many unknowns, we too seem to be on the same roller coaster ride of ups and downs. It might even feel like we are in an 'upper room' secluded from the outside world with time on our hands to reflect on these strange times. In the same way, prayer and friendships, old, new, virtual or otherwise will sustain us too.

- **Choral Evensong** on BBC Radio 3 on Wednesdays at 15.30 and Sundays at 15.00.




