Reflection

A reflection on the Gospel reading – Matthew 10:40-42

“Whoever gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple -truly I tell you, none of these will lose their reward.”

What a little thing, don't you think, to give a cup of cold water? Jesus emphasizes the same by his use of the word “even.” We often imagine discipleship as requiring huge sacrifice or entailing great feats, and sometimes that is exactly what discipleship comes to. But at other times, Jesus seems to say, it's nothing more than giving a cup of cold water to one in need; or offering a hug to someone who is grieving; or a listening ear to someone in need of a friend; or offering a lift to someone without a car; or volunteering at the local foodbank; or making a donation to an relief agency; or...you get the idea.

Discipleship doesn't have to be heroic. Like all the small acts of devotion, tenderness, and forgiveness that go largely unnoticed but tend the relationships that are most important to us, so also the life of faith is composed of a thousand small gestures. Except that, according to Jesus, there is no small gesture. Anything done in faith and love has cosmic significance for the ones involved and, indeed, for the world God loves so much.

You have probably heard the story of the starfish thrower by Loren Eiseley: One day, an old man was walking along a beach that was littered with thousands of starfish that had been washed ashore by the high tide. As he walked he came upon a young boy who was eagerly throwing the starfish back into the ocean, one by one. Puzzled, the man looked at the boy and asked what he was doing. Without looking up from his task, the boy simply replied, “I'm saving these starfish, Sir”. The old man chuckled aloud, “Son, there are thousands of starfish and only one of you. What difference can you make?” The boy picked up a starfish, gently tossed it into the water and turning to the man, said, “I made a difference to that one!”

There is no small gesture, and through your cups of cold water, hugs, helping hands, and listening ears you are caring for the world God loves so much.
