Benefice Reflection

The bells of waiting Advent ring.
The tortoise stove is lit again
and lamp-oil light across the night
has caught the streaks of winter rain
In many a stained-glass window sheen

The holly in the windy hedge
and around the Manor House the yew
will soon be stripped back to deck the ledge
the altar, font and arch and pew,
So, the villagers can say
'The Church look nice' on Christmas day.

Provincial Public houses blaze,
Corporation tramcars clang,
Where paper decorations hang,
and bunting in the red town Hall
Says 'Merry Christmas to you all.'

And London shops on Christmas Eve
Are strung with silver bells and flowers
As hurrying clerks, the City leave
To pigeon-haunted classic towers,
And marbled clouds go scudding by
The many-steepled London sky.

And girls in slacks remember Dad,
And oafish louts remember Mum,
And sleepless children's hearts are glad.
And Christmas-morning bells say 'Come!'
Even to shining ones who dwell
Safe in the Dorchester Hotel.

And is it true? And is it true,
This most tremendous tale of all,
Seen in a stained-glass window's hue,
A Baby in an ox's stall ?
The Maker of the stars and sea
Become a Child on earth for me ?

And is it true ? For if it is,
No loving fingers tying strings
Around those tissued fripperies,
The sweet and silly Christmas things,
Bath salts and inexpensive scent
And hideous tie so kindly meant.....

'Christmas' by Sir John Betjeman 1954

Despite the space this poem has taken up in the benefice magazine this month, my apologies to the editor, I felt it needed to be included this year – because it is pure Joy! Seventy years on, the language might not be considered particularly PC, but for me it evokes a deep sense of nostalgia of a time long past. I do remember going to the village Christmas bazaar and buying some pink bath salts with a rather curious smell, a Christmas present for my mother. The jar sat on the bathroom window sill for years unused. I remember too, walking up to the woods with my dad and siblings to collect holly with bright red berries – to deck the 'halls' of our house.

I suspect for many of you, this poem will evoke a memory, a moment in time, long forgotten and it may not be of Christmas.

Poems, books and newspapers capture 'moments in time.' Looking back over this extraordinary year, I wonder how this 'moment in time' be recorded for the generations to come? 2020 has been a tough one and one that the world was not expecting or prepared for. Some of you will look back and remember loved ones lost to the virus. Some of you might remember feeling just plain worn out, caring for the sick or ensuring the children in our schools are safe from the virus or ensuring that there is food on our tables, ensuring that the post was delivered – I am talking about our health care professionals, teachers and so many others – too many to mention here, you are the people who have held the country together.

I know too that there have been disappointments, weddings, baptisms, VE day celebrations cancelled or postponed. Funerals, well they have been different and sometimes difficult, but as always, it has been a privilege to come alongside families and offer some comfort.

I was shocked when Justin Wellby announced that the Churches would be closed. I understood why, but in times of national emergency, people are drawn to church whether they have faith not. Church offers a place of stillness, a place to make sense of it all and not to be able to offer the community that space has been particularly painful.

Despite this, there have been moments of hope, joy and moments of revelation. We have discovered what is to be a community again. I have witnessed great acts of kindness, people coming together to shop, to collect medicines for those who are vulnerable and shielding or just alone. We have had conversations over fences. Deckchairs and tables have been set out on pavements for morning coffee or afternoon tea with neighbours – socially distanced of course!

In the stillness of the first lockdown we discovered the beauty of the world about us. Spring seemed more abundant, more colourful. I think it's always like this, we've just had the time to enjoy it and appreciate it.

As this strange year draws to an end, the church moves into the season of Advent, a season of reflection and contemplation on the year past and the year to come. Christians are encouraged to do some spiritual spring cleaning and I guess there might be a few people asking 'so where is God in all of this?' Well, I think God has been present in every kind action every kind word spoken and in every selfless action.

So how will 'this moment in time' be recorded? I hope, whether it is recorded in poems, stories or personal testimonies our heroes are recognised. I also hope that it records that humanity had changed and this new sense of community of caring for other became the norm and not just a transient response, and that we found a much greater appreciation for our wonderful world.

At the time of writing this piece, it looks like we will be able to deck the halls with holly, hang paper decorations and join with family members for a short time. Christmas will be different this year, but we can look forward to 2021 with a sense of hope.

And the final verse.....

No love that in a family dwell,
No carolling in frosty air,
Nor all the steeple-shaking bells
Can with this single Truth compare -
That God was man in Palestine
And lives today in Bread and Wine.




