Lent is a snowfall in the soul. Just as snow makes us see our landscape in a different light, making us renavigate our environment and wonder at the sight of our own breath, so Lent invites us to distil, reimagine and remember the fragile miracle of our own self.

We are reminded here that we brought nothing into the world and will take nothing out. As ash is placed on our head on Ash Wednesday, the cross is placed on the heads that house our brains, the centres of our will power and decision-making. These are being called back to life, to a balanced sense and a proportionate understanding of ourselves. Along with Timothy, we are encouraged to pursue love, gentleness and what is right. This letter, like Lent, asks us to stop being indifferent, cautious and compromised. It speaks of the 'life that really is life', the one that is activated and sustained by love of God and our neighbour.

Time presses upon us and tells us we're too busy to be reflective, but our souls know better. Souls die from lack of reflection. Unawareness, like money, is a root of all evil too. Responsibilities distract us and tell us we're too involved with the 'real' world to be concerned about the spiritual questions. But it is always spiritual questions that make the difference in the way we go about our public and day-to-day lives.

Lent Reading

There seems to be a plethora of reading material for Lent this year or perhaps I've just had the time to peruse and reflect. Here are two books which might interest you.

Rooted in Love. Lent reflections on life in Christ. Introduced by Bishop Sarah Mullally. This book offers 40 reflections that lead us deep into the meaning and practice of life in Christ today. Prompting questions such as: Who is the Christ we serve? What does it mean to be part of the body of Christ? How can we live more Christ centred lives? If you prefer to dip in and out of a book, this is perfect. Each reflection is followed by a suggested response/action and prayer. Some of these reflections and prayers will be read during Lent in Morning Prayer and Compline.

Living his Story – The Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book 2021. Revealing the extraordinary love of God in ordinary ways by Hannah Steele. 'Stories tell us who we are, where we belong and how we relate to the world around us. The gospel of Jesus Christ is the story at the heart of the universe, and yet the Church now finds itself in a culture that has largely forgotten this good news. How can we convey the extraordinary love of God to our neighbours in a strange post -Christian world?' An excellent read, challenging and thought provoking.

This year's Lent Course.

'Encountered. Meeting God in ordinary places' by Claire Benton-Evans. A course which explores the ordinary places of the Easter story in which the extraordinary events of Jesus's life, death and resurrection occurred. The five sessions and accompanying meditations will ask us to examine the reality of these places which Jesus knew so well, and engage with the Gospel stories in a fresh, informed and imaginative way. The sessions will also encourage us to look at the ordinary places in our own lives and rediscover them as places where we might meet the living God.


