~New~ Thought for the week (Luke 24: 36-48 Acts 3: 12-19)

There is a church in San Francisco, USA, called St Gregory of Nyssa. It is a very mixed and inclusive Christian community, with people of all ages and backgrounds. And it has become well-known for a number of different things, one of which is its worship. A particular feature of their worship is the joyful singing and dancing that takes place – particularly around the communion table.

But it is also well-known for its community work and, in particular, for its ‘food pantry ministry’. I think we would say ‘food kitchen’. Each and every week, the food pantry distributes food to about 800 families in that part of San Francisco.

The inspiration came from journalist, Sara Miles. She had grown up as a dedicated atheist. She didn’t believe in God, or Jesus, or any of that stuff. But, for no known earthly reason, early one morning in 1999, she wandered into St Gregory of Nyssa church and joined a communion service. She received the bread and wine. And the experience completely transformed her life. She was converted there and then. She embraced a faith that previously she had scorned.

But with that came an important discovery: that the Christian faith, at least for her, wasn’t all about angels or pious behaviour or even being good. It was about people

– real hungry people. People who longed to be fed, who needed to be fed. Before long she had turned the bread that she ate at communion into tons, literally tons, of groceries, piled up and ready to be given away. And within a few years, she and the people of the community of St Gregory of Nyssa had started nearly a dozen food pantries in the poorest parts of San Francisco.

She later wrote a book about her experience which is called *Take This Bread*. In it she writes: ‘the mysterious sacrament turned out to be not a symbolic wafer but actual food – indeed, the bread of life’ (Sara Miles, *Take This Bread*. The spiritual memoir of a twenty-first century Christian, Norwich: Canterbury Press 2012).

The emotional impact of that first encounter with Jesus – in a communion service – made Sara Miles want to extend the life of Jesus through actual food. Just as Jesus did himself when he appeared to his disciples and ate with them.

So what are we planning to do next?
