### Thought for Pentecost (Acts 2: 1-21 John 15: 26-27, 16: 4-15)

On the day of Pentecost, the disciples experienced the Holy Spirit. It was, Luke says, like tongues of flames. It was like a great and rushing wind. They began to speak in other languages – and those who saw and heard all this were deeply affected too. That was 2,000 years ago. How do we experience Holy Spirit now? What words and expressions would we use to describe our experience?

Someone recently wrote this: London's Tate Modern gallery staged an exhibition of 20th-century paintings. One wall was just a blank painted surface. Directly opposite this wall was one of Monet's paintings of water lilies. After staring at the Monet for ages, I turned around to look at the blank wall behind me – but it was no longer

blank and plain. Monet's vibrant, swirling colours changed what I saw from something flat and formless into something that had shade and texture. It may have been a trick of the light, or physical effect within my eye or something to do with perception in my brain, but I was reminded of Luke's vivid and eye-opening picture of Pentecost, with its wind and fire and noise. And that in turn made me think about how praying with the Spirit can open our eyes to the life and energy of God in our world: to see new things; to see things differently; to begin to appreciate God's concerns for the whole of creation rather than just my own, often rather petty, concerns for my life and world, and my little corner of creation.

Wouldn't it be something if the Spirit of Pentecost could open all of our eyes to see the broader picture that is God's perspective? Let us open ourselves to the Spirit and take a look around.
