my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.
- 7 In God is my strength and my glory; •
God is my strong rock; in him is my refuge.
- 8 Put your trust in him always, my people; •
pour out your hearts before him, for God is our refuge.
- 9 The peoples are but a breath,
the whole human race a deceit; •
on the scales they are altogether lighter than air.
- 10 Put no trust in oppression; in robbery take no empty pride; •
though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it.
- 11 God spoke once, and twice have I heard the same, •
that power belongs to God.
- 12 Steadfast love belongs to you, O Lord, •
for you repay everyone according to their deeds.

Jonah 3.1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, 'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.' So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

Mark 1.14-20

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake—for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

Thought for the Month

A few Sundays ago, we were treated to an evening of music and poetry given by Pauline and Chris Dowie. One of the poems, beautifully read by Pauline was 'Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness' by John Keats;

Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness,
Close bosom-friend of the maturing sun;
Conspiring with him how to load and bless
With fruit the vines that round the thatch-eaves run;
To bend with apples the moss'd cottage-trees,
And fill all fruit with ripeness to the core;
To swell the gourd, and plump the hazel shells
With a sweet kernel; to set budding more,
And still more, later flowers for the bees,
Until they think warm days will never cease,
For summer has o'er-brimm'd their clammy cells.

This is the first of four verses and whilst I was listening; I was reminded that all too soon another year is fading, the sun is lower in the sky, the nights are drawing in. The church slips into the quieter season of Remembrance. A season where we will remember the Saints that have gone before us, Peter, Paul and Mark, to name but a few. We also remember the 'other' saints who worked tirelessly for our communities,

not wishing for any accolade or thanks. They did what they did in faith and out of love for the community they lived in.

We remember the ones that we loved who have died, through illness, age, in a long-ago war or a more recent conflict.

So pause for a moment, not just on 14th November, but over the coming weeks and give thanks to each of them for the many ways they enriched our lives, our families and our community. Remember the love that bound us together with them in life still binds us in their new life. ~ Belinda


Texts will cost the donation amount plus one standard network rate message.



This is a work for choir and organ, originally written as a birthday present to Trinity Boys Choir of Croydon, but later incorporated into my Cantata “From Darkness to Light” which was first performed in Wimborne Minster in 1984. 


