Sunday's Readings

Isaiah 66.10-14

Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad for her, all you who love her; rejoice with her in joy, all you who mourn over her—that you may nurse and be satisfied from her consoling breast; that you may drink deeply with delight from her glorious bosom.

For thus says the Lord: I will extend prosperity to her like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing stream; and you shall nurse and be carried on her arm, and dangled on her knees. As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you; you shall be comforted in Jerusalem. You shall see, and your heart shall rejoice; your bodies shall flourish like the grass; and it shall be known that the hand of the Lord is with his servants, and his indignation is against his enemies.

Luke 10.1-11, 16-20

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, ‘The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road.

Whatever house you enter, first say, “Peace to this house!” And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking

whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, "Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near." 'Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me.'

The seventy returned with joy, saying, 'Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.'

- 1 Be joyful in God, all the earth; •
sing the glory of his name;
sing the glory of his praise.
- 2 Say to God, 'How awesome are your deeds! •
Because of your great strength
your enemies shall bow before you.

New~ Reflections for July

On Sunday 19th June, Bishop Stephen was enthroned as Diocesan Bishop of Salisbury. At the service in the Cathedral envelopes, each with a £10 note inside, were handed out, with instructions that the money should be used in whatever way thought best. The Bishop was obviously thinking of a story which Jesus told in Matthew ch. 25.

A man was going away entrusted his property to his servants – each one according to their ability - so he gave five talents to one, two to another and one to a third. The servant with five talents and the one with two traded with them and doubled their money; the one with a single talent did what **he** thought best and hid his master's money in the ground, to keep it safe.


When the Lord returned home, he praised the two servants who had used the talents, and who had risked them in trade and doubled the amount but the third, who thought his master a hard man, was told that he was wicked and slothful, and should at least have placed the money with a banker. In Jesus' time the talent was worth a great deal of money and was the highest denomination of coin.

Nowadays, most of us think of the word 'talent' with a different meaning. A talent is something we are good at, a gift, or ability or a skill. We all have God-given talents and abilities and we must use them in the best way we can and to the full. Everybody is good at something, however small and unimportant it seems. God gives us all differing gifts and whatever talent we have we must think of ways we can use it in the service of God and others.

Please complete a registration form obtained from the village shop and post it into the box provided. We do have a restriction in numbers and need to know numbers so that we can provide lunch for the children. To help us to ensure that the scheme works well and the children are adequately supervised, any children under 7 **must** be accompanied by a parent/carer.

Once I receive your registration document, I will then deliver a form to you that needs to be completed for each child with details regarding allergies etc and emergency contact details. You will then receive confirmation of your child's place on the scheme for the days that you have selected. If we are over-subscribed for any sessions then I will set up a waiting list.

Registration each day will take place at Stourpaine Village Hall and we will finish off each day with a session at the playpark where parents can collect their children. The children will also be involved in making their own lunch.

If there are any parents or villagers that would be prepared to be one of the helpers then please let me know as soon as possible. There is no charge for these sessions as they are being subsidised by Holy Trinity Church, Stourpaine.


