Reflection

Jesus said, "Love the Lord your God with all you heart and with all your soul and with all your mind". God's love for us is unconditional, but we cannot love God without his help and for that it is necessary for us to hear and to receive his word. This is shown in our Gospel reading for this Sunday. This is where Jesus tells the parable, the story, of the Sower. Using an illustration about farming he tells of seed which is sown, falling onto different kinds of ground and what happened to it. Some of the seeds fell onto thin soil, some on soil on rocky ground, some amongst thorns or weeds and some fell into good soil.

The seed represents the Word of God and the different ways it can be heard. If a person's mind is closed, then the word cannot enter. If the mind is shallow, the word will not form deep roots and that person will have no deep faith or commitment. If the person has lots of interests, 'like the weeds that grow in abundance' then that person might be too busy to pray, and the Word will be crowded out. But the person who has an open mind, like the good soil, will be prepared to hear and never unwilling to learn. That is the one who stays loyal to God and yields the fruits of worship and the love of God. Things beyond our imagining are all prepared by God for those who love him. I wonder what kind of soil we are?

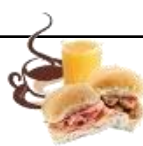
