Please follow the guidance posted at the entrances to each Church. This is in line with the current guidance issued by the Government, H&S Executive and CofE. When the Churches are closed our church porches will still be available as **Prayer Spaces** for private prayer.

I will collect them on Saturday morning. Unfortunately, due to the current restrictions, we are not able to provide pens and paper. **Services in Church! Services in church have resumed.** There is one service of Holy Communion\* at 4.00pm in one of the churches in the benefice except for the first Sunday of the month, when there will also be a BCP service of Holy Communion in Holy Trinity at 8am. The Sunday service rota from 9 August to 13 September can be found on page 6 and on the Website. Services are open to all and everyone across the Benefice.

*\* This Sunday (9<sup>th</sup> August) the 4pm Service in Church will be Sunday Worship, (non-eucharistic) as Belinda is away.*

It is understood that there will be some disappointment that we are not able to offer more in-church services at this time. The guidance from the HSE and Church of England on 'opening church for public worship' runs into pages. We have had to find ways of meeting the guidance while at the same time maintaining a sense that our lovely churches are places where we gather as a community to worship God and to pray.

The completed risk assessment for 'opening churches for worship' can be found on the Benefice website.

**If you are thinking of attending a service**, please could you consider the following:

- Hymn books, Bibles and service orders have been safely stored away. If you are attending the BCP service, please could you bring a copy of the Prayer Book with you. For other services there will be a take-away service sheet for you to keep.
- Social distancing in church remains at two metres. This means we need to restrict the number of people attending the service. It would be helpful if you could let the appropriate Church Warden know by 7.00pm on Saturday that you would like to attend the service on Sunday.(see over)

- You will be asked to wait at the door; the church warden or sides person will direct you to your seat.
- **New regulation from HM Government: The wearing of face coverings is mandatory when attending Church Services.**
- At the end of the service, please remain seated until you are asked to leave by the church warden or sides person.
- The toilets at St Peter's and St Nicholas' churches will not be open for use.
- There will be a retiring collection at the end of the service. Please place your gift in the basket as you leave. However, there is high level risk of cross contamination associated with coins and notes. If this is your usual way of giving, could you perhaps now consider paying by standing order?
